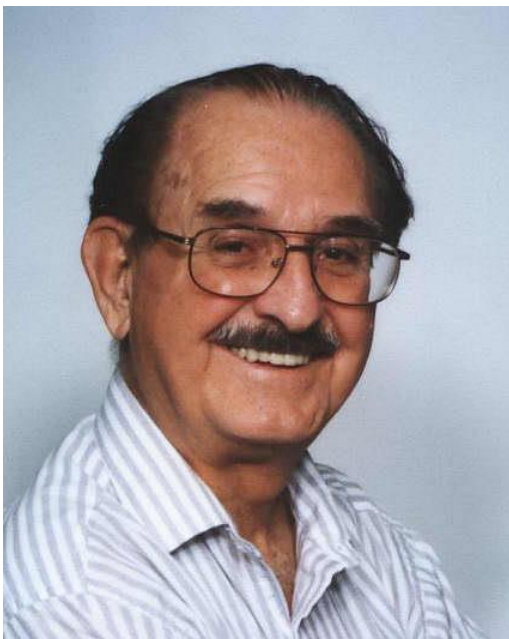

- Bachelor of Science – Penn State University 1949
- Masters of Science – University of Idaho 1951
- Kraft Foods technologist 1960 to 1967
- Early pioneer of frozen meat, pot pies, fruit pies and frozen dinners
- First to successfully create cooked turkey roll
- Inventor of original Weight Watchers Frozen Dinners and creator of nine new specialty weight-loss food products
- College Professor at Delaware Valley College, St. Joseph's College, University of Minnesota, and University of Wisconsin
- Founder and Director of "Build a Wider Bridge." 1989 to 1994 – This non-profit organization acquired and shipped over 108,000 food-related technical books, free of charge, to 19 universities in six nations.
- Distinguished Achievement Award from Southern California Institute of Food Technologists
  - Author of 10 published books
  - Father of four college-educated sons
  - Member of MENSA
  - Inventor of several word games



Walter was a pioneer in the prepared foods industry, a college professor at Delaware Valley, St. Josephs, University of Minnesota, and University of Wisconsin, an author of 10 published books, a philanthropist, an inventor, a member of MENSA, and a world traveler.
